This matter is before the Chief Procurement Officer (CPO) pursuant to a letter of protest from SO-PAK-CO, Inc., also known as SOPAKCO. With this invitation for bids (IFB), the Materials Management Office (MMO) attempts to procure a statewide term contract for an estimated 600,000 MREs (Meals, Ready-To-Eat) plus 600 pallets. In the letter, Sam Reichardt of SOPAKCO protested MMO's processing of the solicitation; specifically that MMO did not mail SOPAKCO a copy of the IFB.

As the issue of law in this is clear, this decision is prepared based upon an administrative review of the procurement file without the benefit of a hearing.

NATURE OF PROTEST

The letter of protest is attached and incorporated herein by reference.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The following dates are relevant to the protest:

1. On June 7, 2012, MMO released the IFB. (Ex. 1)
2. Also on June 7, 2012, the IFB was advertised in South Carolina Business Opportunities (SCBO) (Ex. 2)
3. On July 3, 2012, MMO opened the bid received.
4. On July 10, 2012, MMO posted its award to AmeriQual Group for \$1,869,800. (Ex. 3)
5. On July 17, 2012, SOPAKCO delivered its protest to the CPO.

DISCUSSION

In the protest letter, Ms. Reichardt of SOPAKCO wrote,

We were originally registered under Crown Point, our sister company, but in September of 2007 Crown Point no longer handled the sale of the MRE and sales were brought in house to SOPAKCO, the supplier and remit to, for Crown Point.

I received a call on or around July 9, 2012 from Cheryl Patrick (MMO Procurement Manager). She was inquiring as to why SOPAKCO, who had held the SC contract for so many years, did not submit a bid for the MRE contract. I explained to her that I had not received the request via mail as I had in the past. That is when she informed me that there was a change in late 2007 that said SC would no longer mail bid request and they could only be obtain *[sic]* by logging into the state procurement online site and searching for the request.

In 2007, the State implemented the South Carolina Enterprise Information system (SCEIS), with MMO in the vanguard of the implementation. SCEIS is a statewide enterprise resource planning (ERP) software system that automates state agency procurement, budgeting, accounting, expenditure, and human resources processes. In order to bid to the state, a bidder must register in SCEIS. During registration, a bidder must identify the classifications of goods or services it wishes to sell to the state. When procurement officers use SCEIS to generate a solicitation, they may enter the classification codes for the goods or services in the invitation for bids. If the classification code in the IFB matches one the bidder selected during registration, SCEIS generates an email message notifying the vendor of an opportunity to bid. Each bidder is responsible for entering and maintaining his own bidding profile along with the classifications of products and services he sells.

The June 7, 2012, online edition of South Carolina Business Opportunities (SCBO) included the following advertisement on page 11:

As indicated in the advertisement, the solicitation itself could be downloaded by clicking through the internet address in the SCBO notice.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

SOPAKCO alleges the state did not advise it of the solicitation. SOPAKCO notes, “We have held the state wide contract for the past several years – July 30, 2007 – July 29, 2012 and the award prior.”

Section 11-35-1520(3) of the Code provides:

Notice. Adequate notice of the invitation for bids shall be given at a reasonable time prior to the date set forth therein for the opening of bids. Such notice shall include publications in a newspaper of general circulation in the State such as “South Carolina Business Opportunities” or through a means of central electronic advertising as approved by the Office of General Services.

The statute requires adequate notice, not actual notice. The Procurement Review Panel has ruled “that the MMO met its burden of giving ‘adequate notice’ of the IFB ... by publishing it on MMO’s website and having it published in SCBO as required by Section 11-35-1520(3) of the Code.” *Appeal by Warren Truck Equipment, Inc.*, Panel Case No. 2002-1. No further notice is required. *See Protest of Quantum Resources*, Panel Case No. 1990-17 (“[N]othing in the statute or regulations governing this procurement required State Procurement to send a copy of the IFB to Quantum Resources.”)

Despite having adequate notice as required by law, SOPAKCO did not submit a bid. Only actual bidders may protest. Code Section 11-35-4210(1)(b). The Panel has addressed this issue many times during its thirty-year history. Most relevant to this case, the Panel wrote the following in a very similar case:

The Panel has discussed the issue of standing in several previous cases, most notably, *In Re: Protest of Laurens County Service Council for Senior Citizens*, Case No. 1990-18. The Panel found that only an “actual bidder” to the IFB has standing to protest the award or intended award of the IFB. S.C. Code Section 11-35-4210(1) provides, in part, “any *actual bidder*, offeror, contractor, or subcontractor who is aggrieved in connection with the intended award or award of a contract shall protest to the appropriate chief procurement officer ...” [emphasis added]. Winyah did not submit a bid in response to the IFB, so is not an “actual bidder.” S.C. Code Section 11-35-4210(1) also provides, in part, “any *prospective bidder*, offeror, contractor, or subcontractor who is aggrieved in connection with the solicitation of a contract shall protest to the appropriate chief procurement officer ... ” [emphasis added]. Neither can Winyah be a prospective bidder once bids are opened, as no opportunity to submit a bid exists.

Most recently, the Panel upheld its prior decisions concerning standing in Case No. 1994-5, *In re: Protest of Smith & Jones Distributing Co. Inc.* As the Panel has previously determined, after bid opening, a vendor that has not submitted a bid, has no standing to protest a solicitation or award. Therefore, Winyah is not a “prospective bidder” or “actual bidder.” The Panel finds that Winyah does not have standing to protest under S. C. Code Ann. Section 11-35-4210.



DETERMINATION

Because SOPAKCO was not an actual bidder, it lacks standing to challenge either the solicitation or the award. Therefore, its protest is dismissed.

STATEMENT OF RIGHT TO FURTHER ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW
Protest Appeal Notice (Revised July 2012)

The South Carolina Procurement Code, in Section 11-35-4210, subsection 6, states:

(6) Finality of Decision. A decision pursuant to subsection (4) is final and conclusive, unless fraudulent or unless a person adversely affected by the decision requests a further administrative review by the Procurement Review Panel pursuant to Section 11-35-4410(1) within ten days of posting of the decision in accordance with subsection (5). The request for review must be directed to the appropriate chief procurement officer, who shall forward the request to the panel or to the Procurement Review Panel, and must be in writing, setting forth the reasons for disagreement with the decision of the appropriate chief procurement officer. The person also may request a hearing before the Procurement Review Panel. The appropriate chief procurement officer and an affected governmental body shall have the opportunity to participate fully in a later review or appeal, administrative or judicial.

FILE BY CLOSE OF BUSINESS: Appeals must be filed by 5:00 PM, the close of business. *Protest of Palmetto Unilect, LLC*, Case No. 2004-6 (dismissing as untimely an appeal emailed prior to 5:00 PM but not received until after 5:00 PM); *Appeal of Pee Dee Regional Transportation Services, et al.*, Case No. 2007-1 (dismissing as untimely an appeal faxed to the CPO at 6:59 PM).

FILING FEE: Pursuant to Proviso 83.1 of the 2012 General Appropriations Act, "[r]equests for administrative review before the South Carolina Procurement Review Panel shall be accompanied by a filing fee of two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00), payable to the SC Procurement Review Panel. The panel is authorized to charge the party requesting an administrative review under the South Carolina Code Sections 11-35-4210(6), 11-35-4220(5), 11-35-4230(6) and/or 11-35-4410...Withdrawal of an appeal will result in the filing fee being forfeited to the panel. If a party desiring to file an appeal is unable to pay the filing fee because of financial hardship, the party shall submit a completed Request for Filing Fee Waiver form at the same time the request for review is filed. The Request for Filing Fee Waiver form is attached to this Decision. If the filing fee is not waived, the party must pay the filing fee within fifteen days of the date of receipt of the order denying waiver of the filing fee. Requests for administrative review will not be accepted unless accompanied by the filing fee or a completed Request for Filing Fee Waiver form at the time of filing." PLEASE MAKE YOUR CHECK PAYABLE TO THE "SC PROCUREMENT REVIEW PANEL."

LEGAL REPRESENTATION: In order to prosecute an appeal before the Panel, an incorporated business must retain a lawyer. Failure to obtain counsel will result in dismissal of your appeal. *Protest of Lighting Services*, Case No. 2002-10 (Proc. Rev. Panel Nov. 6, 2002) and *Protest of The Kardon Corporation*, Case No. 2002-13 (Proc. Rev. Panel Jan. 31, 2003).

I would like to know how to place a formal protest for the upcoming MRE contract with the state of SC.

We have held the state wide contract for the past several years - July 30, 2007 - July 29, 2012 and the award prior

We were originally registered under Crown Point, our sister company, but in September of 2007 Crown Point no longer handled the sale of the MRE and sales were brought in house to SOPAKCO, the supplier and remit to, for Crown Point.

We continued selling to the State Agencies under the state contract and in August of 2011 there were changes to the state procurement office and some agencies were having hard times processing purchase orders. At this time I spoke with and exchanged emails with a Carol Norfleet. She updated the contact information and updated some other information under the vendor number 7000032764 (Crown Point). Since this time I have received emails and calls from state agencies all of which were aware of the changes to pricing and contacting information.

I received a call on or around July 9, 2012 from a Cheryl Patrick. She was inquiring as to why SOPAKCO, who had held the SC contract for so many years, did not submit a bid for the MRE contract. I explained to her that I had not received the request via mail as I had in the past. That is when she informed me that there was a change in late 2007 that said SC would no longer mail bid request and they could only be obtain by logging into the state procurement online site and searching for the request.

I explained to her the confusion regarding the current contract and the company changes and told her I was under the impression all the contact information had been updated. She did a search of the system and said that SOPAKCO and the contact, me, Sam Reichardt, were not in the system. This was strange to me as I had recently been contacted by state DOT offices that were aware of the changes in contact information (phone and email) and the price for the MREs. If we were not in the system I'm not sure how they were able to find this information.

I also asked when notice had been sent stating the State of SC would no longer be sending out mailed request for State contracts as they had in the past 13 years that I have been with the company. She said she wasn't aware

that any notice had been sent out but that everyone was aware. I beg to differ as this was not how SOPAKCO had been doing business with the state for the prior two contracts for MREs.

Since agencies were able to contact me with my new contact information and were aware of the price changes implemented August of 2011 I am not sure why the system failed to email me the request for bid on the upcoming contract.

By researching this the past week I find out that although we have the current State Contract our company is not registered or located anywhere in the system -

no searches for SOPAKCO or our F.E.I.N #62-0788091 came back as being in the system. Which I find very odd since we have sold to and received payment under the contract.

Any and all information regarding this matter would be greatly appreciated.
